#### **New Accreditation Endorsement Launched**

CSI is advancing its mission by offering the **Teaching for Transformation (TfT) Accreditation Endorsement**, developed with the Center for the Advancement of Christian Education (CACE) at Dordt University. This bold initiative weaves the TfT site visit into the CSI Accreditation process, helping schools more fully live out their faith-driven missions.

#### **Provisional Accreditation Introduced in 5 States**

CSI's new provisional accreditation process empowers schools in Arkansas, Indiana, Iowa, Oklahoma, and Texas to meet state requirements while pursuing full accreditation. This process affirms that schools are actively working through the CSI Accreditation process, maintaining accountability and ensuring continuous improvement, while still allowing schools newer to accreditation to access school choice funds.

#### CSI Accreditation and Its Impact Across the Globe

With your generous support, CSI now serves 181 schools through accreditation—a testament to our shared commitment to Christ-centered excellence. This year, 156 educators participated on 31 Accreditation Site Visit Teams, helping schools thrive and empowering leaders for the next generation.

Over the past year, CSI led head of school searches at Washington Christian Academy (MD), Mount Vernon Christian School (WA), and Celeryville Christian School (OH), and facilitated governance workshops at nine schools—including repeat engagements that reflect trusted, ongoing relationships. Our consulting team delivered over 325 complimentary consultations, welcomed new administrators in four states, and connected with more than forty schools through regional gatherings in Michigan, Indiana, and Wisconsin.

These collective efforts reflect the strength of our shared mission: equipping Christian schools with the leadership and tools they need to thrive.

CSI's professional learning events in 2024–25 were guided by a clear goal: to equip Christian educators to integrate faith into all aspects of school life.

Through in-person offerings like **Beautiful Work** events, the **Emerging Leaders Development Institute (ELDI)**, and the **Principal Development Institute (PDI)**, alongside virtual initiatives such as **In the Loop** webinars, CSI provided a
comprehensive learning pipeline for leadership development.

Across all formats, participants reported a renewed sense of calling, practical tools for change, and the encouragement of a like-minded professional community—all essential for advancing thriving, Christ-centered education.

### **Making Creation Integral**

### Our Inaugural Christian Deeper Learning Gathering

The Making Creation Integral gathering marked a milestone in our leadership of Christian Deeper Learning (CDL). Building on CSI's vision for CDL, this event brought together several dozen educators from five countries and three continents, all dedicated to transformational teaching and guiding students to know God more deeply through his creation.

Attendees highlighted moments like the "bamboo activity," collaboration with peers, and onsite exploration of a host

school's learning environment as catalytic for both spiritual and instructional growth. Many left inspired by the connection between deep learning and creation care, underscoring CDL's holistic approach to education—rooted in biblical purpose, authentic learning, and joyful stewardship. As we carry the CDL story forward, events like this one will continue to model the integration of faith and learning—preparing young people not just to know about the world, but to love and serve it well.






